This training will review Supported Employment as an evidence-based practice, with discussion of each of the core principles. We will explore the range of obstacles experienced by People in Recovery, and the various roles that different service providers can play in supporting individuals' interest in employment as part of their overall Recovery process. We will discuss the Stages of Change as it is applicable to individuals' vocational development, and service strategies that can be effective in helping people at each stage.

By the end of the presentation, participants will be able to:

1. List the core principles of evidence based Supported Employment.
2. Describe the role and value of employment to the overall Recovery process.
3. Examine the obstacles faced by individuals in pursuing and maintaining employment.
4. Recognize the roles that different service providers can play in helping individuals with employment goals.
5. Apply Stages of Change theory to the vocational development process.
6. Identify service strategies that are appropriate to each stage.

Karen Escovitz, MSS: Ms. Escovitz is Associate Director of Employment Initiatives at Project Home. She has expertise and has provided training and technical assistance in the following areas: Recovery and Recovery-Oriented Services, including Motivational Interviewing, Stages of Change, Trauma Informed Services, Community Integration, Illness Management and Recovery (SAMHSA Toolkit), and Evidence-Based Supported Employment.
