Description: This course provides a description of trauma and its impact on individuals seeking behavioral health & other human services. The prevalence of these issues is discussed and the course reviews the developmental, physiological, cognitive, and emotional results of experiencing of trauma for individuals. Information is provided on how individuals who have experienced trauma can remain affected, and how they present in behavioral health settings.
