Description: This introductory, interactive course addresses behavioral health and other human services staff being exposed to traumatic material shared by persons coming in for service. A theoretical framework for examining the impact of vicarious traumatization (VT) on staff is presented as well as methods for assessing its impact. Strategies for preventing and addressing VT that helps build resilience are discussed and a peer consultation model is presented that can be used formally or informally in the work environment to support staff exposed to traumatic material.
