“The New Bullying 101”

Presenter: Deborah McCoy, Educational Development Services, LLC
Ms. McCoy has extensive experience working in educational settings, working for the PA Department of Education as a SAP Regional Coordinator and a consultant to schools on bullying and safety issues. She also works in close collaboration with the PA Masonic Youth Foundation. *(Ms. McCoy has disclosed no real or apparent conflict of interest regarding this course.)*

Program: Extraordinarily high numbers of students report being targeted for bullying, including cyber-bullying, both in and outside of school. Bullying is a form of youth violence that can result in physical harm, emotional distress, and even death. Targeted students are at increased risk for mental health issues, physical illnesses and poor academic performance. Those who engage in bullying are at greater risk for substance-abuse issues and greater violence later in life. This program will examine the current realities contributing to the seriousness of bullying and suggest strategies for helping both targets and bullies.

Learning Objectives: By the end of this workshop, participants will have:
1. Defined bullying and listed the associated behaviors;
2. Outlined short-term and long-term effects of bullying;
3. Explained the connection between bullying and other forms of violence; and,
4. Listed the principles for effective intervention and prevention.

Target Audience: This workshop is intended for all those who work in the Children’s Behavioral Health System. There are no pre-requisites. **This workshop is limited to 35 participants.**
